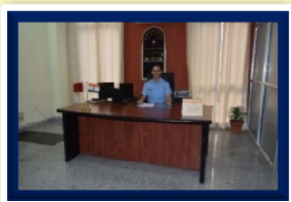

In order to cope with the rapidity with which knowledge itself changes, today's student must seek to achieve academic excellence. Academic excellence is the demonstrated ability to perform, achieve, and excel in scholastic activities. But academic excellence is more than just making good grades. It is the maximum development of your intellectual capabilities and skills in service to humanity.

Achieving excellence in all aspects of life is a process of both formal and informal education. Indeed, education is a limitless and unending process to be enjoyed for a lifetime. Our school being one of the Sainik Schools has been working for the holistic development of cadets since its inception and trying its best to reach the apex of education.

Academics.

The pursuit of academic excellence is our stated vision and it has been the endeavour of the school to orient all efforts to reach the highest levels of academic achievements. Over the past year, the cadets of the school have proved their academic capabilities in various academic assessments.

Cadet Sumit Kumar, the topper of class 7th scored 98.71 percentage followed by Cadet Aman Kumar with 98.14 percent and Cadet Divyansh Chaudhary with 97.42 percent marks. In class 6 cadet Vikram Pratap Singh became the highest scorer scoring 96.42 percentage followed by Tarun Kumar with 95.57 percent and Dev Raj Singh with 94.42 percent marks. One of our cadets Baibhav Yadav won First Prize in All India Inter School Quiz Competition conducted by Sainik School Lucknow on their Diamond Jubilee.

The school had conducted a number of exams, class tests, assessments, assignments,

Online quizzes to keep the competitive edge of the cadets throughout the year. The overall performance has been quite encouraging and the results analysis portrays a definite upward curve. We are confident that this would be manifested in resounding results in the forthcoming CBSE and Annual Exams.

FIELD MARSHAL SAM HORMUSJI FRAMJI JAMSHEDJI **MANEKSHAW**

(3 APRIL 1914- 27 JUNE 2008)



Field Marshal Sam Hormusji Framji Jamshedji Manekshaw was perhaps a one-off military general who caught the nation by storm. Nicknamed as Sam Bahadur, the most celebrated general had a career in the military spanning four decades. Sam Bahadur fought five wars, beginning from the World War II in 1942. As the Army Chief, Manekshaw led the Indian Army to its momentous victory in the 1971 Indo-Pak war.

He was given the nickname 'Bahadur' by soldiers of the 8th Gorkha Rifles where he was reassigned after the Independence in 1947. Henceforth, he came to be popularly known as 'Sam Bahadur'.

Manekshaw was born to a Parsi family on April 3, 1914 in Amritsar, Punjab. His father Hormusji Manekshaw was a doctor in the British Indian Army during First World War. Jemi Harmusji Framji Manekshaw – his younger brother – served in the armed forces as well.

Manekshaw – the first General of the Indian Army to be promoted to the five-star rank of Field Marshal – faced resistance from his father to join the Army. But he eventually took the IMA entrance examination and came off with flying colours securing the sixth rank. He was part of the first course – christened 'The Pioneers' – of INA.

In his 40-year military career, Manekshaw fought five wars – World War II, 1948 Kashmir War Against Pakistan and Afghan tribals, 1962 Indo-Sino war, 1965 and 1971 Indo-Pak wars.

He got married on April 22, 1939 in Bombay and had two daughters – Sherry and Maya – with his wife SilooBobde.

On one occasion, when the-then PM Indira Gandhi asked General Manekshaw about the Indian Army's preparedness for the 1971 Indo-Pak war, the dapper officer replied, "I am always ready, sweetie." It is said that he referred to Gandhi as 'Sweetie' due to their Parsi connection.

The gallant General is known to have escaped death on many occasions. During the Second World War, he suffered serious bullet injuries in his stomach. Fortunately, he was saved by an Australian surgeon who operated on him and took out bullets lodged in his lungs, liver and kidneys. In fact, he lived to his ripe old age.

Field Marshal Manekshaw was also known for coruscating wit and quotes. One of his famous quote that has taken on timeless proportion is, "If a man says he is not afraid of dying, he is either lying or he is Gorkha."

He was honoured with the Military Cross for gallantry in 1942, the Padma Bhushan in 1968 and the Padma Vibhushan in 1972.

Mankeshaw breathed his last on June 27, 2008 in Wellington at the age of 94.

MATHEMATICS IN OUR WORLD

Derived from the contribution of ancient scholars, the body of knowledge and practice known as mathematics gives us a way to understand patterns, to quantity relationships, and to predict the future.

The world is interconnected. Everyday math shows these connections and possibilities. Applications of differential equations can explain how quickly water becomes contaminated and how many people in a country drinking that water might become sickened on a yearly basis. A study of geometry can explain the science behind architecture throughout the world. Statistics and probability can estimate death tolls from earthquakes, conflicts and other calamities around the world. It can also predict profits, how ideas spread, and how previously endangered animals might repopulate. The recent studies in Math have potential to show students how the world consists of situations, events and phenomena that can be sorted out using the right math tools.

Math is often studied as a pure science, but is typically applied to other disciplines, extending well beyond Physics and Engineering. For instance, studying exponential growth and decay (the rate at which things grow and die) within the context of population growth, the spread of disease, or water contamination, is meaningful. It not only gives students a real – world context in which to use the Math, but helps them understand global phenomena – they may hear about a disease spreading in India, but can't make the connection without understanding how fast something like cholera can spread in a dense population.

In a similar vein, a study of statistics and probability is key to understanding many of the events of the world. Probability and statistics can be used to estimate death tolls from natural disasters, such as earthquakes and tsunamis; the amount of aid that might be necessary to help in the aftermath; and the number people who would be displaced.

Understanding the world also means appreciating the contributions of other cultures. In algebra, students could benefit from studying number systems that are rooted in other cultures, such the Mayan and Babylonian systems. They gave us elements that still work in current Math systems, such as the 360 degrees in a circle, and the division of the hour into 60 minute intervals, and including this type of content can help develop an appreciation for the contributions other cultures have made to our understanding of Math.

It's important, though, to only include examples that are relevant to Math and help students make sense of the world. In geometry, for example, Islamic tessellations – shapes arranged in an artistic pattern – might be used as a context to develop, explore, teach and reinforce the important geometric understanding of symmetry and transformations. Students might study the different types of polygons that can be used to tessellate the plane (cover the space without any holes or overlapping) and even how Islamic artists approached their art. Here, the content and the context contribute to an understanding of the other. Math is not just some subject that is confined to the sums we solve in our school notebook. As evident from the facts above, Math is more about what's around us than what we write on paper.
