GARGI VACHAKNAVI: THE PHILOSOPHER



The great Indian sage Gargi Vachaknavi was one of the earliest symbols of feminism in the world. Born in the 9th to 7th century BCE, in Northern India, near Mithila, she was a natural-born philosopher. She was a renowned exponent of Vedic literature.

Born as the daughter of sage Vachaknu, she was also the descendant of the great sage Garga. She was named after these two illustrious personalities as Gargi Vachaknavi. From a young age, she was interested in Vedic literature and Vedic philosophy.

Her mother was against this idea. She had seen firsthand how a sage got immersed in the religious texts and forgot about practical living as a householder. She wanted young Gargi to marry and become a grahini.

But the strong-headed Gargi had more intellectual and spiritual goals in her mind. She was greatly interested in learning the Vedas and Puranas. She was endowed with great intelligence and became proficient in the complex philosophies of all four Vedas.

Even men who strived to be her equal in intellect could not surpass her knowledge in this field. Rishi Gargi as she is known is even mentioned in the Rigveda; in its Griha Sutra. Through her deep meditation, she revealed some of the mantras in the Rigveda. Her views on philosophy are considered so exalted that they find mention in the Chandyog Upanishads.

She was greatly honored and respected for her mastery of the science and the philosophies of the Vedas. She participated and gave lectures in Brahma Yagyas and was bestowed with the title of Brahma Vadini. It was a testimony to her greatness that she was recognized as one of the Navaratnas (Nine Jewels) in the court of King Janak of Mithila.

THE NATIONAL FLAG

The tricolor, comprises three colour horizontal strip of deep Saffron (keasri), representing courage and sacrifice at the top, White (peace and truth) in the middle and Dark Green (faith and chivalry) at the bottom. The ratio of the width of the flag to its length is 2:3. In center of white band is a Chakra in Navy Blue with 24 spokes on the Abacus of Sarnath, Lion Capital of Ashoka. The design of the national flag was adopted by the Constituent assembly of India on 22 July 1947. Prevention of improper use act, 1950, the prevention of insults to National Honour. Act, 1971, and few other law enacted on the subject guidelines for using the flag with dignity and pride.

Incorrect Displays

A damaged or disheveled flag should not be displayed. The flag should not dipped in salute to any person or thing. The flag should not be used to cover a speakers desk nor should it be draped over a speakers platform. The flag should not be displayed with saffron down. The flag should not touch ground or the floor in trail in water. The flag should nor be displayed or fastened in any manner that may damage it.

100 Years of Tricolour

On 02 August 1876 Pingali Venkayya was born in Machilipatnam, Andhra Pradesh. He was educated at Cambridge and become a polymath. He met Gandhiji in South Africa. In 1921, Pingali, presented the draft design of the flag to M.K Gandhi at the AICC session held at Vijaywada. Gandhiji's approval of his design had made the Swaraj flag popular and it was in use till 1931. The CWC came up with new tricolour by replacing the red with saffron, on top, followed by white and then green. A spinning wheel (Gandhi Charkha) was placed on the white.m Post-Independence, a national flag committee under President Rajendra Prasad replaced the Charkha with the Ashok Chakra. India completed 100 years of her tricolour on March 31, 2021. PingaliVenkayya, as a freedom fighter designed India's first national flag on March 31, 1921. Now India has completed 101 years 4 months 21 days of her tricolour.

HISTORY OF CARTOGRAPHY

The history of cartography is not older than 5000 years. The earliest maps of which we have knowledge were made by 'Babylions' on clay tablets, dating around 2300 BC. Early attempts at maps were severely limited by lack of knowledge of anything other than very local features. Of course what constitutes a map is hard to say, especially when one goes back to the very earliest times. Around 6200 BC IN Catal Hyuk in Anatolia a wall painting was made depicting the positions of the streets and houses of the town together with surrounding features such as the volcano close to the town. Whether it is a map or stylized painting is a matter of debate. Early world maps also reflects the religious beliefs of the form of the world.

The earliest ancient Greek who is said to have constructed a map of the world is 'Anaximander', who was born in 610 BXC in Miletus (now in Turkey) and died in 546 BC. Sadly, no details of his map have survived. Notable Greek philosophers and mathematics such as "Pythagoras", "Aristotle", "Eratosthenes "and "Hipparchus" made notable contributions to the study of ancient cartography.

The final ancient Greek contribution to cartography, considered the most important was written by a noted mathematician. In about AD 140 "Ptolemy" wrote his major work, 'guide to geography ' in eight books, which attempted to map the known world giving coordinates of the major places in terms of what are essentially 'latitudes' and longitudes'. Given the way that he gathered the data it is not surprising that the maps were inaccurate by they did represent a considerable advance on all previous map and it would be many centuries before more accurate world map would be drawn.

As the world advances, as the unknown is revealed and surveyed, as human alter the face of the Earth with their new settlements, new states, railways, canals, land reclamation and cultivation, these changes are reflected in the maps of the times.

POPULATION GROWTH

One major problem that faces the world today is the rapid growth of population, often referred to as population explosion. Until about 800 AD the world's population stayed below 200 million. Since then it has risen dramatically. The rise has been greatest in the 20th century. The population has recently risen to about six billion: it is three times as large as it was in 1960. It is not so much the actual population as its rate of increase that is alarming. Experts predict that by 2020 there will be about ten billion people, causing serious problems of hunger, overcrowding and environmental pollution. The enormous increase of population is due to better food, better hygiene and, above all, the advances made in medicine. Rapid development in modern medicine has conquered many diseases and consequently the death rate has decreased. Until the beginning of the 19th century most people died before the age of 50. Today in developed countries the average lifespan has risen to more than 70 years. The population goes on increasing at an alarming rate in spite of the practice of birth control in many parts of the world. Thomas Malthus, a British mathematician and economist, went to the extent of declaring that, if unchecked, human population world grow in geometric progression (i.e. 1, 2, 4,8,and so on) white food production could only grow in arithmetic progression (i.e.1,2,3,4,and so on). He was, of course, very pessimistic. With a population of over one billion. Indian is the second most popular country in the world. (China), India's population today is rising by 2.9% per year, and in consequence, every year an extra 26 million people have to provide for. The government is talking measures to check the population growth and a large percentage of people practice birth control. Recent advances in farming have feed the present population. Failure to arrest further increase of population may have disastrous effects, through there seems to be some truth in the statement made by Chandan of Sainik school Mainpuri: although population growth means there will be more mouths of feed, there will be "more hands to work & more brain to think".

ARUNIMA SINHA: FIRST FEMALE AMPUTEE TO SCALE MOUNT EVEREST


